

BIODESIX PRIVACY POLICY

Biodesix, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Biodesix," "us," "we," "our," or "Company") has created this Privacy Policy to apply to users of this website (https://www.biodesix.com) and all digital assets contained, or offered therein (collectively, our "Services"), except as described below. This Privacy Policy describes, among other things, the types of information we collect from users when you use our Services, how we use it, and how you can access your information.

This Privacy Policy is integrated into our Terms & Conditions of Use ("Terms & Conditions").

By using the Services and providing us with your Information (defined below), you acknowledge and agree to the practices described in this Privacy Policy and Terms & Conditions referenced above and to the updates to these policies posted here from time to time.

This Privacy Policy does not apply to information collected by or provided in connection with an individual's application for employment, current or former employment, or independent contractor arrangement with Biodesix, which is addressed separately.

This Privacy Policy does not apply to Protected Health Information ("PHI") as defined under the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act and related regulations, as amended (collectively referred to as "HIPAA"), including information you provide to us in relation to serving you as a patient. Our privacy practices related to PHI are described in our <u>HIPAA Notice of Privacy Practices</u>.

This Privacy Policy also does not apply to information collected in the course of clinical trials. Clinical trial data is subject to study-specific informed consent documents and applicable laws.

If you are coming to our Services from the European Union (EU), European Economic Area (EEA) of United Kingdom, and would like to know more about how we collect, use, and process your Information please see our <u>GDPR Notice</u>.

I. INFORMATION WE COLLECT ABOUT YOU

We may collect the following categories of information about you which are described in more detail below: (A) information you provide to us, (B) information we may automatically collect, and (D) information we may receive from third parties. To the extent that this information includes, "Personal Information" or "Personal Data" as defined under the appliable law, this information is referred to collectively as "Information". Specifically, Information includes any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person, who could be identified either directly or indirectly by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier, or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural, or social identity of that natural person.

A. Information You Provide to Us

In using our Services, you may provide us with Information, including, without limitation:

- Individual identifiers such as name, contact information such as mailing address, phone number, and email address;
- Communications with us, preferences, and other Information you provide to us such
 as any messages, opinions, and feedback that you provide to us, your user
 preferences (such as in receiving updates or marketing information), and other
 Information that you share with us when you contact us directly (such as for
 customer support services); and
- Additional Information as otherwise described to you at the point of collection or pursuant to your consent.

B. Information We May Automatically Collect About You

Our Services may automatically collect the following categories of usage and technical Information about you. This Information is used by Biodesix for the operation of the Services, to maintain quality of the Services, and to provide general statistics regarding use of the Services. This Information may include:

- IP address, which is the number associated with the service through which you access the Internet, like your ISP (internet service provider);
- Date and time of your visit or use of our Services; and
- Your activity on the website.

C. Cookies & Technologies Used to Collect Information About You

We and/or certain service providers operating on our behalf may collect information about your activity, or activity on devices associated with you over time, on our sites and applications. We may collect this Information by using certain technologies, such as cookies, web beacons, software developer kits, and other similar technologies. Third-party service providers and/or partners may also view, edit, or set their own cookies.

- <u>Cookies (or browser cookies)</u>. A cookie is a small file placed on the hard drive of your computer. You may refuse to accept browser cookies by activating the appropriate setting on your browser. However, if you select this setting, you may be unable to access certain parts of our Services. Unless you have adjusted your browser setting so that it will refuse cookies, our system will issue cookies when you direct your browser to our website.
- Web Beacons. Website pages may contain small electronic files known as web beacons (also referred to as clear gifs, pixel tags, and single-pixel gifs) that permit us, for example, to count users who have visited those pages and for other related statistics (for example, recording the popularity of certain content and verifying system and server integrity). We also use these technical methods to analyze the

traffic patterns, such as the frequency with which our users visit various parts of the Services. These technical methods may involve the transmission of Information either directly to us or to a third party authorized by us to collect Information on our behalf.

Analytics and Fraud Detection. Analytics are tools we may use, such as Google Analytics, to help provide us with information about traffic to our website and use of our Services. We may also use reCAPTCHA, a tool which utilizes advanced risk analysis techniques to distinguish humans and bots in order to help us protect our websites from fraud, spam, and abuse.

D. Information We May Receive from Third Parties

We may collect additional Information about you from third-party websites, social media platforms and/or sources providing publicly available information (e.g., from the U.S. postal service) to help us provide services to you and/or help prevent fraud.

This Privacy Policy only applies to Information collected by our Services. We are not responsible for the privacy and security practices of those other websites or social media platforms or the Information they may collect (which may include IP address). Links to any other websites or content do not constitute or imply an endorsement or recommendation by us of the linked website, social media platform, and/or content.

II. HOW WE USE YOUR INFORMATION

A. Use and Purpose of Processing Your Information

We use and process your Information for things that may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- To provide you with the Services and Information you request;
- To respond to your inquiries and questions and provide customer service;
- For general marketing and advertising purposes, provided that you have not optedout of receiving such communications;
- To maintain, improve, customize, or administer the Services, perform business analyses, or other internal purposes to improve the quality of our business, the Services, resolve technical problems, improve security or develop other products and services;
- To comply with our Terms and Conditions;
- For analytics for business purposes and intelligence;
- To comply with any applicable laws and regulations and respond to lawful requests;
 and/or

• For any other purposes disclosed to you at the time we collect your Information and/or pursuant to your consent.

B. Disclosing Your Information

We may disclose your Information as set forth in the Privacy Policy and in the following circumstances:

- Third-Party Service Providers. We may disclose your Information to third-party service providers that perform certain functions or services on our behalf. These third-party service providers are authorized to use your Information only as necessary to provide these services to us.
- Disclosure of Information for Legal and Administrative Reasons. We may disclose your Information without notice: (i) when required by law or to comply with a court order, subpoena, search warrant, or other legal process; (ii) to cooperate or undertake an internal or external investigation or audit; (iii) to comply with legal, regulatory, or administrative requirements of governmental authorities (including, without limitation, requests from the governmental agency authorities to view your Information); (iv) to protect and defend the rights, property, or safety of us, our subsidiaries and affiliates, and any of their officers, directors, employees, attorneys, agents, contractors, and partners, and the website Service users; (v) to enforce or apply our Terms of Use; and/or (vi) to verify the identity of the user of our Services.
- **Business Transfers.** Your Information may be transferred, sold, or otherwise conveyed to a third party where we: (i) merge with or are acquired by another business entity; (ii) sell all or substantially all of our assets; (iii) are adjudicated bankrupt; or (iv) liquidate or otherwise reorganize.
- Information Shared with our Subsidiaries and Affiliates. We may share your Information with our subsidiaries and affiliates.
- **De-Identified or Aggregated Data.** We may share your Information on an aggregated basis for any purpose where your personal Information is blinded, masked, or otherwise not identifiable.
- With Your Consent. We may disclose Information consistent with this Privacy Policy with your consent.

C. Selling and Sharing Information

We do not disclose personal information to third parties in exchange for monetary compensation. However, we may disclose identifiers (such as IP address) and aggregated internet activity information to service providers solely for purposes of improving our website. Additionally, we do not sell or share your Information and do not use your Information for targeted advertising. We do not sell or share sensitive personal Information, nor do we sell or share personal Information about individuals we know are under age sixteen (16).

III. LINKS TO OTHER WEBSITES

Our Services may contain links to other websites that are not owned or controlled by us, including links to social media platforms such as Meta, Instagram, or YouTube, which redirect you off of our website.

This Privacy Policy only applies to Information collected by our Services. We are not responsible for the privacy and security practices of those other websites or the Information they may collect. You should contact such third parties directly for information about their privacy practices. Links to any other websites or content do not constitute or imply an endorsement or recommendation by us of the linked website, social media platform, and/or content.

IV. INFORMATION SECURITY

We use commercially reasonable and appropriate administrative, physical, and technical security measures to provide our Services and safeguard your information. However, no data transmitted over the Internet or stored or maintained by us or our third-party service providers can be 100% secure. Therefore, we do not promise or guarantee, and you should not expect, that your Information or private communications will always remain private or secure. We do not guarantee that your Information will not be misused by third parties. We are not responsible for the circumvention of any privacy settings or security features. You agree that we will not have any liability for misuse, access, acquisition, deletion, or disclosure of your Information.

If you believe that your Information has been accessed or acquired by an unauthorized person, you should promptly contact us at Privacy@biodesix.com so that necessary measures can quickly be taken.

V. DATA RETENTION

We will retain your Information for as long as needed to provide you Services, and as necessary to comply with our legal obligations, resolve disputes, and enforce our policies. We will retain and use your Information as necessary to comply with our legal obligations, resolve disputes, and enforce our agreements. In accordance with our routine record keeping, we may delete certain records that contain Information you have submitted to us. We are under no obligation to store such Information indefinitely and disclaim any liability arising out of, or related to, the destruction of such Information.

VII. NOTICE OF PRIVACY RIGHTS FOR RESIDENTS OF CERTAIN U.S. STATES

VIII. EXERCISING YOUR DATA SUBJECT RIGHTS

To exercise any of the rights described above, please submit a verifiable consumer request to us via the methods described below. The verifiable consumer request must:

- Provide sufficient information that allows us to reasonably verify you are the person about whom we collected Information, or an authorized representative; and
- Describe your request with sufficient detail that allows us to properly understand, evaluate, and respond to it.

To help protect your privacy and maintain security, if you request access to or deletion of your Information, we will take steps and may require you to provide certain information to verify your

identity before granting you access to your Information or complying with your request. In addition, if you ask us to provide you with specific pieces of Information, we may require you to sign a declaration under penalty of perjury that you are the consumer whose Information is the subject of the request.

If permitted by the applicable data protection law, you may use an authorized agent to submit requests on your behalf provided that the authorized agent is a natural person or a business entity that you have authorized to act on your behalf. If you use an authorized agent, we will require: (1) proof of written permission for the authorized agent to make requests on your behalf, and identity verification from you; or (2) proof of power of attorney pursuant under applicable law. Only you or your authorized agent may make a verifiable consumer request related to your Information. We may deny a request from an authorized agent that does not submit proper verification proof. If you designate an authorized agent to make a request on your behalf, we may require you to provide the authorized agent written permission to do so and to verify your own identity directly with us (as described above). You may also make a verifiable consumer request on behalf of your minor child.

IX. GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION OF DATA STORAGE AND PROCESSING
